# Juvenile Alcohol and Drug Awareness Program

## Teen Substance Abuse Awareness Seminar (TSAAS)

The Teen Substance Abuse Awareness Seminar is designed to educate at risk youth regarding the nature and consequences of addictive behaviors. The seminar will serve the purpose of planting seeds of knowledge and understanding of self medicating behaviors, legal and personal consequences and methods to initiate and support behavioral changes.

Each participant will:

1. Increase their knowledge of substance abuse and related consequences/dangers.
2. Gain an understanding of behavioral recovery and how to access support.
3. Understand what drives addictive behaviors and how to use alternative resources to aid in working through personal issues without resorting to self medication.
4. Increase their understanding of the legal, social and familial ramifications of their behaviors.
5. Experience MADD panel members who have been impacted by substance abusers.

**Registration begins at 8:00 am**

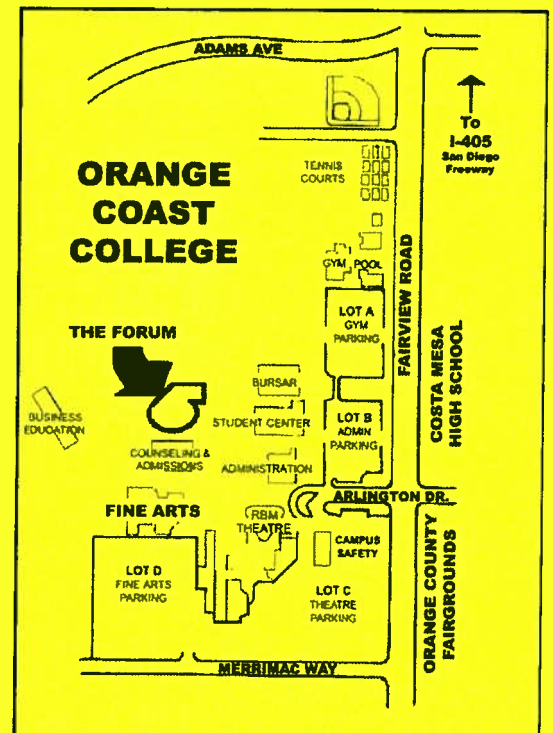
**Students are not admitted late!**
