Note: The architecture program at USC is a five year program. Students will be placed in the program based upon a review of their course work and portfolio. Placement is either in the first or second year of the program. It is possible that a transfer student may be placed at the second year level or above if previous work includes a minimum of 32 semester units of acceptable academic credit in a pre-architecture program.

The academic credit must include eight semester units in architectural design (ARCH 115, 215, 230). These courses have prerequisites and/or concurrent enrollment requirements. Transfer applicants are required to submit a portfolio prior to the application deadline. The School of Architecture has a seven week summer design studio that allows transfer students to be evaluated for placement into the fall semester. During the summer studio, transfer students must demonstrate significant design and drawing skill to justify advanced placement. Successfully completing this summer studio allows students to reduce the required 10 semester design sequence by two semesters.
