

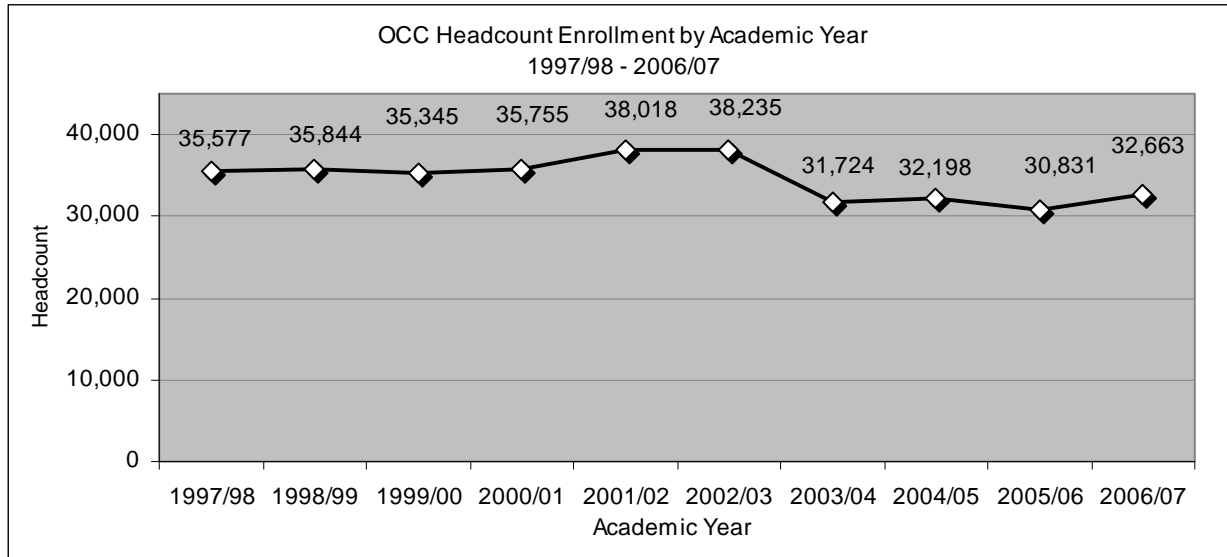

OCC Headcount by Academic Year

The number of students enrolled at Orange Coast College per academic year has increased 5.6%. Since that time, student headcount has fluctuated. A 20.5% decline in 2003/2004 was observed, which marked an end to increasing student enrollment in the early 2000's.



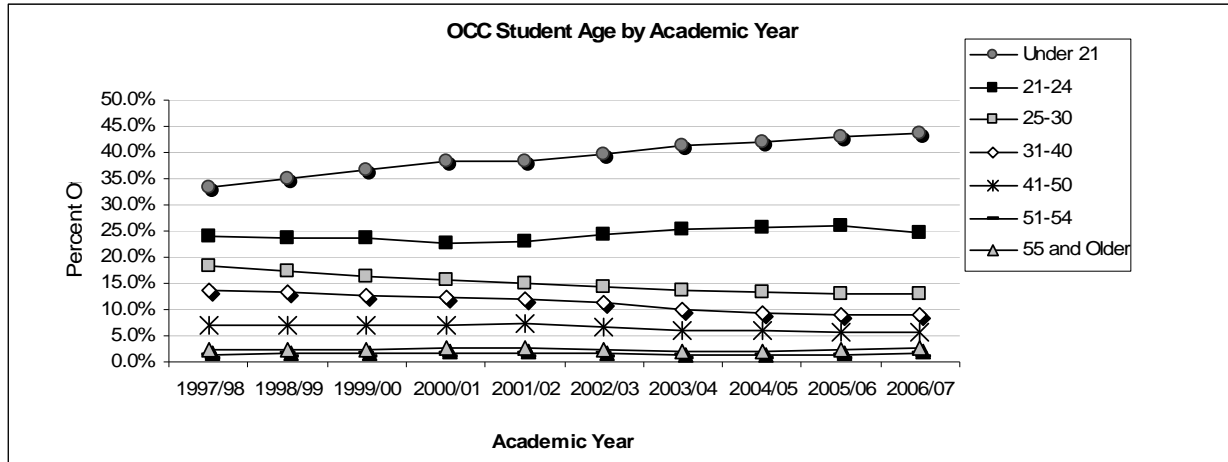

OCC Student Age by Academic Year

Since 1997/1998, OCC's total number of students under 21 years old has increased from 11,803 to 14,247 in 2006/2007 resulting in a 33.2% in 1997/1998 to 43.6% in 2006/2007. A slight increase was observed in the percent of students over 50 in the 2006/07 academic year. Although increasing in headcount, the percentage of students in the 21-24 group declined for the first time since 1998/99, signaling a potential slow down in comparative growth.



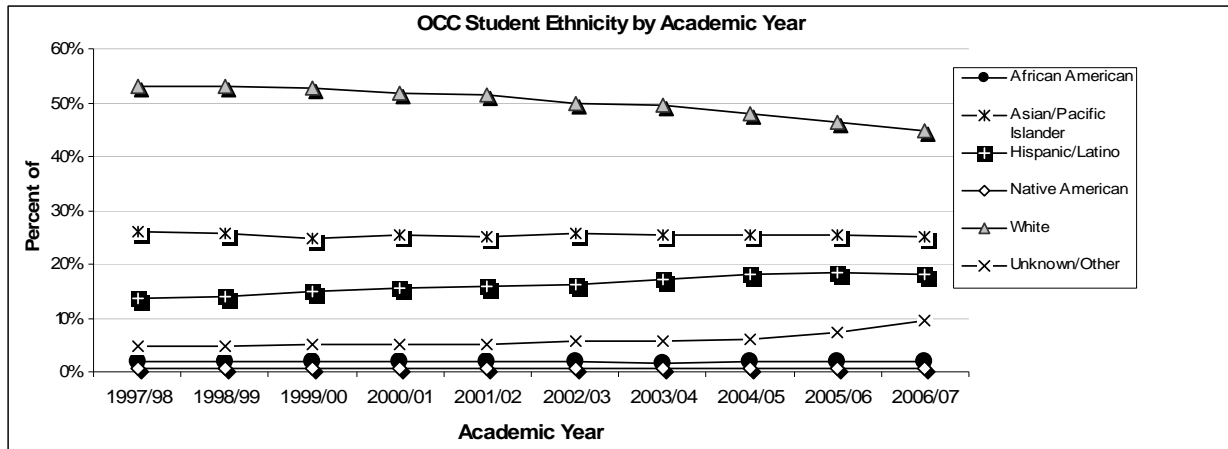

OCC Student Ethnicity by Academic Year

Since 1997/1998, OCC's ethnic composition has become more diverse. Although Caucasian students still represent the majority group, this group has decreased from 53.0% in 1997/1998 to 44.9% in 2006/2007. This decrease is the result of increases among Hispanic students, who accounted for 13.6% in 1997/1998 and increased to 18.0% in 2006/2007. The African American, Asian/Pacific Islander and Native American groups have remained relatively constant since 1997/1998.



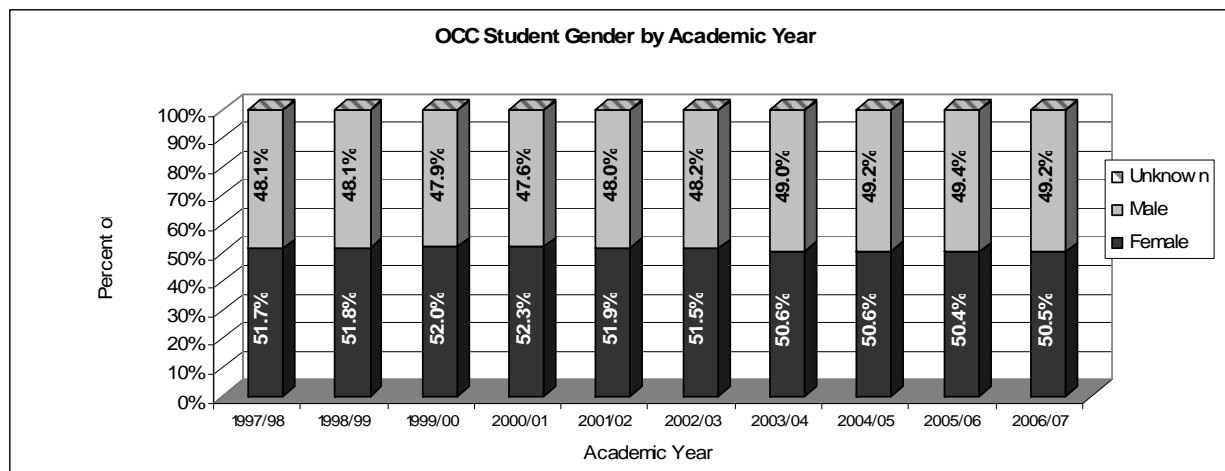

OCC Student Gender by Academic Year

OCC's female student population reached a high of 52.3% in 2000/2001, up from 51.7% in 1997/1998. Since that time, a downward trend has occurred. In 2006/2007, the female population remained similar to 2005/2006 at 50.5% while male students accounted for 49.2% of the total student population.



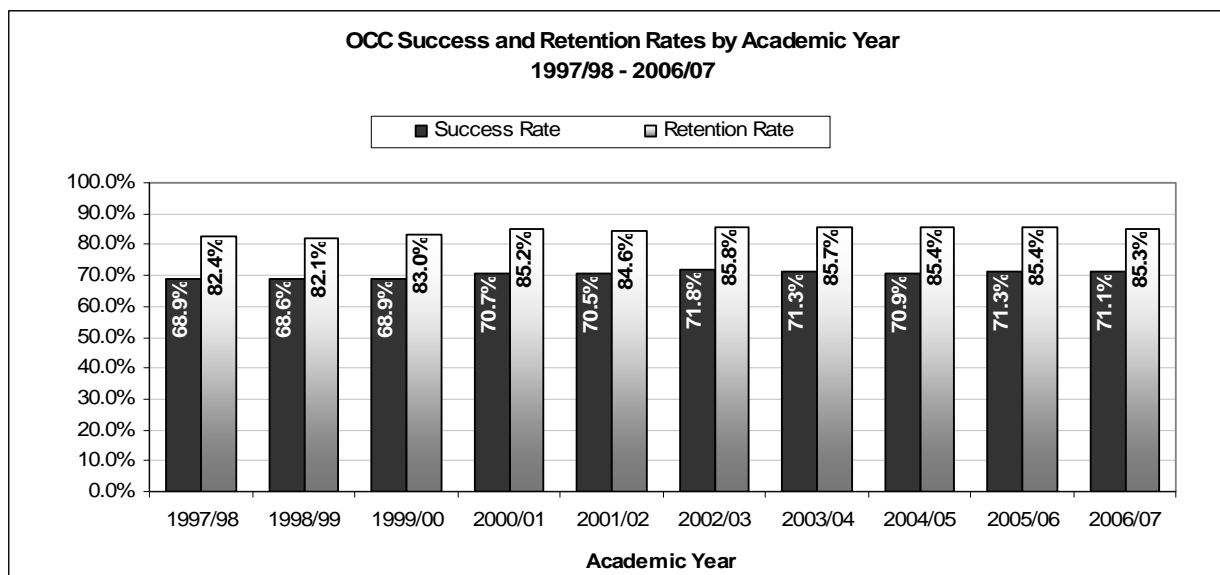

OCC Success and Retention Rates by Academic Year

OCC's overall success rate has remained fairly constant until 2000/2001. In 2000/2001, the overall OCC success rate increased to 70.7% and increased to a high of 71.8% in 2002/2003. OCC's success rate showed minor fluctuation over the next few years and is now at 71.1% as of 2006/2007. The OCC retention rate has increased from 82.4% in 1997/1998 to 85.3% in 2006/2007.



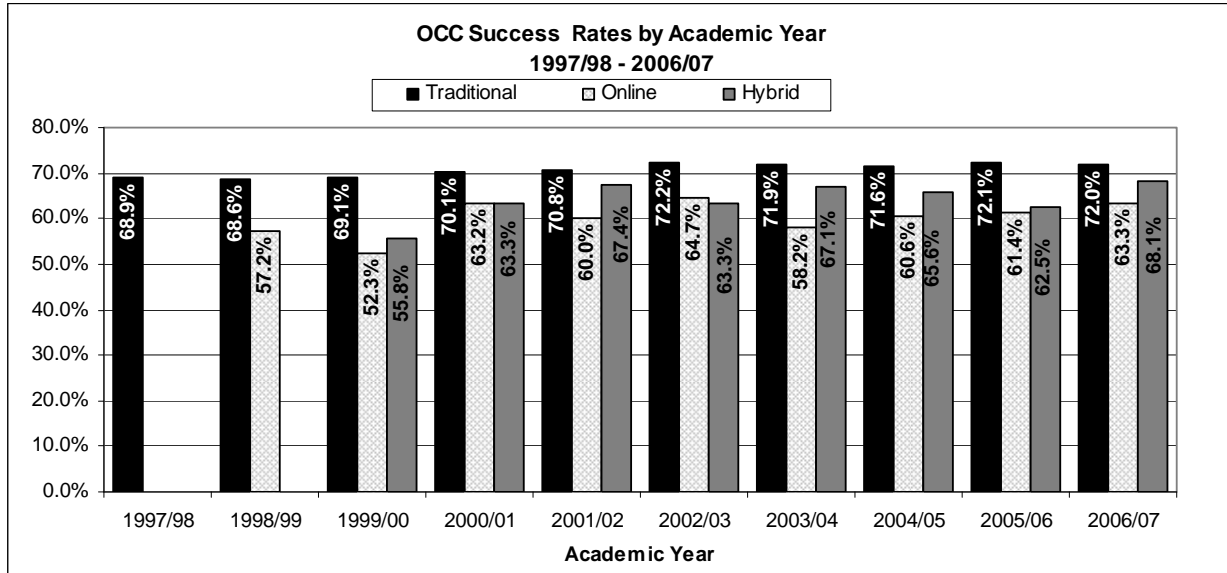

OCC Success Rates by Academic Year by Modality

OCC's success rate for online courses has increased significantly since these courses were introduced in 1998/99. The overall success rate was 57.2% in 1998/99 compared to 63.3% in 2006/07. Online success rates reached their lowest point in 1999/00 (52.3%) and peaked at 64.7% in 2002/03. Success rates for OCC's hybrid courses follow a similar pattern as online courses. Hybrid courses began in the 1999/00 year (55.8%) and had their success rates increase to a high of 68.1% in 2006/07.



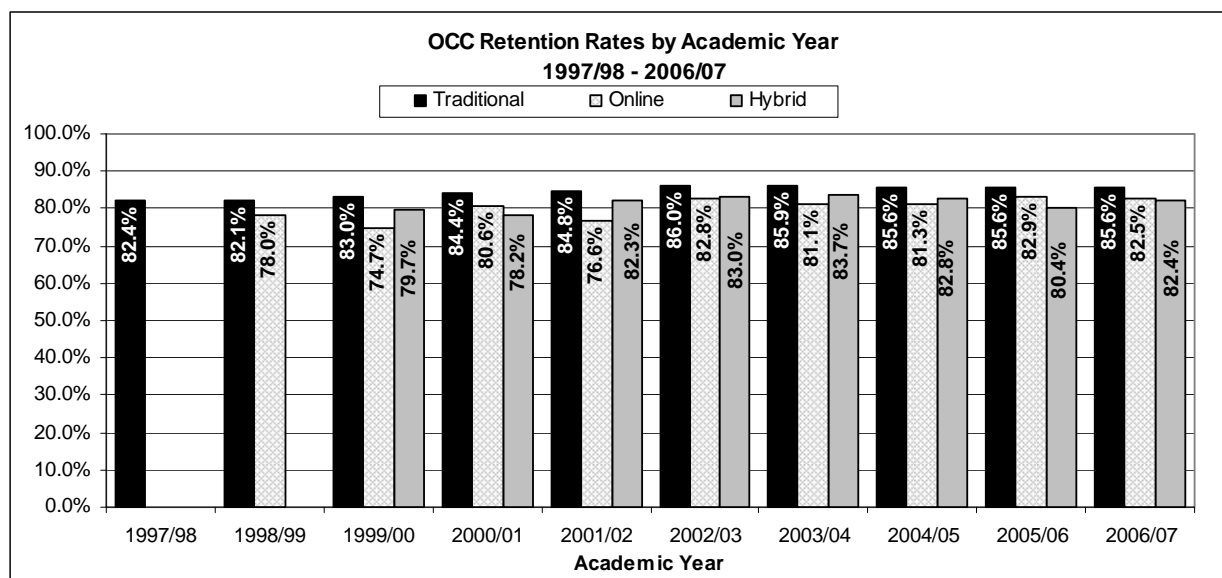

OCC Retention Rates by Academic Year by Modality

OCC's retention rate for online courses has increased by 4.5% since online courses were offered in 1998/99. The online course retention rate was 78.0% in 1998/99 and increased to 82.5% in 2006/07. Hybrid course retention rates were 79.7% in 1999/00, climbed to 83.0% in 2002/03, and declined slightly to 82.4% in 2006/07.
