

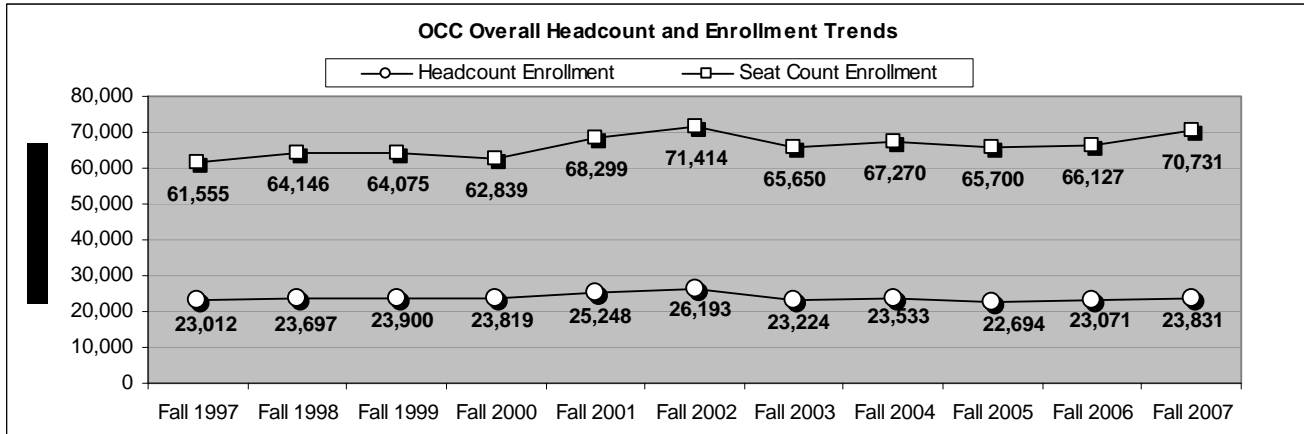

## OCC Headcount and Enrollment Trends

Headcount enrollment represents the total number of students attending OCC. Seat count enrollments represent the total number of courses students were enrolled in. In Fall 2007, both headcount and seat count enrollment increased. Student headcount increased by 3.3% and seat count enrollment also increased by 7%.

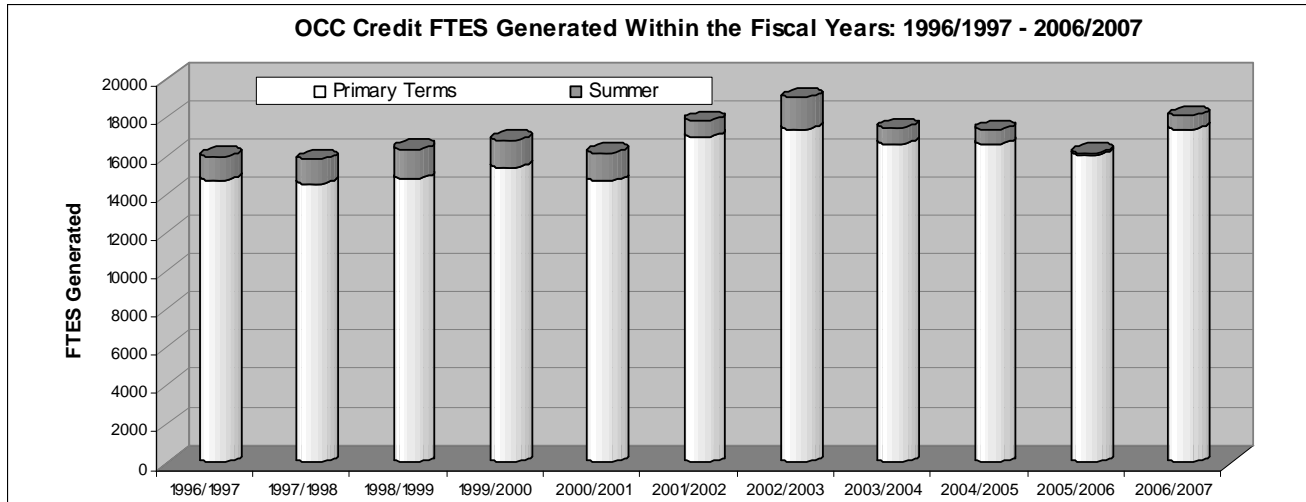

## OCC Credit FTES Generated Within the Fiscal Years

OCC credit FTES generated within each fiscal year gradually declined from 1996/1997 through 1997/1998. An increase in the reported OCC credit FTES was observed in 1998/1999 through 1999/2000, it showed a slight dip in 2000/2001 and increased each year through 2002/2003. Decreases have been observed since that time. A decrease in course sections offered preceded enrollment for the 2003/2004 year and contributed to this decline. In 2005/2006, FTES decreased, but increased 12% in 2006/2007.

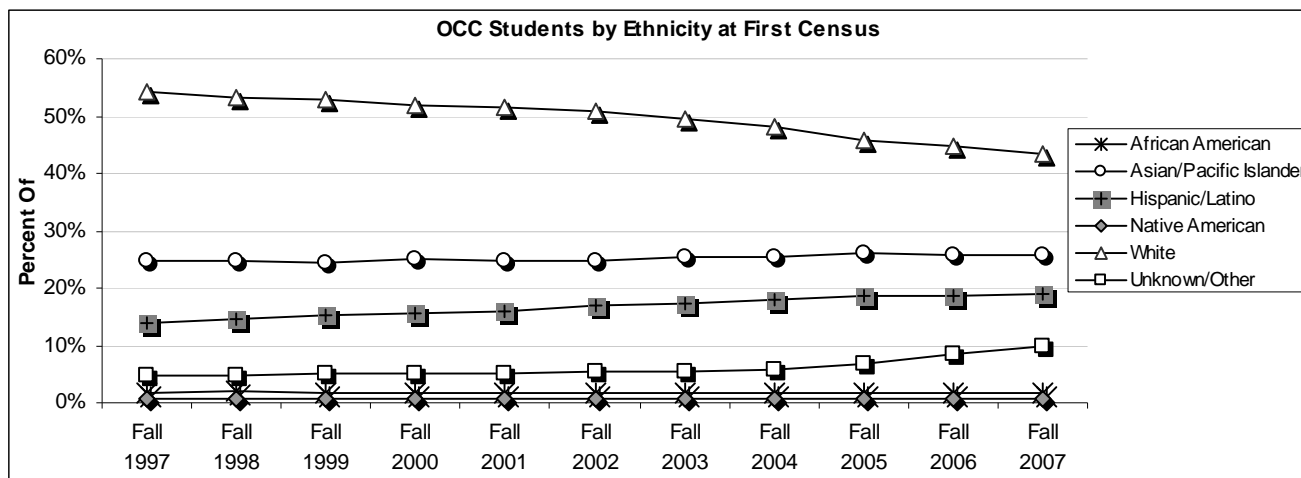

## Ethnicity

Although Caucasian students still account for the majority of OCC students (Fall 2007, 43.3%), this group has showed the largest decline among any other ethnic group since Fall 1997. Hispanic student population has increased significantly since Fall 1997. Hispanic/Latino students accounted for 14.1% of all students in Fall 1997 compared to 19.1% in Fall 2007. African American, Asian/Pacific Islander, and Native American student populations have remained relatively constant over the past ten years.

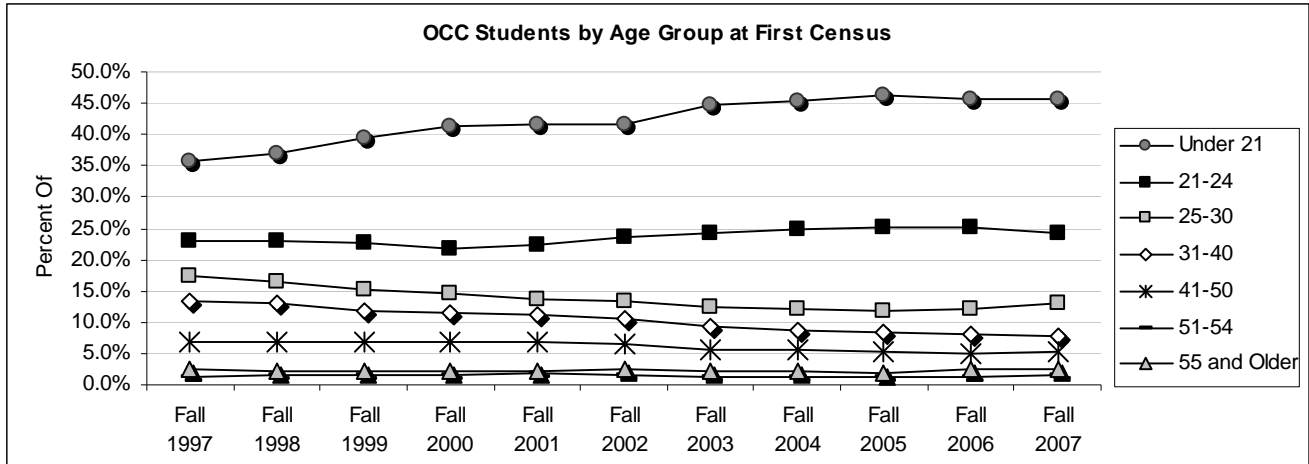

## Age

Younger students (under 25) are the largest and fastest growing group of OCC students. The growth of this group began to decline slightly by Fall 2006. In Fall 1997, students under 25 comprised 58.5% of the OCC student population. The under 25 group reached an all time high of 71.3% in Fall 2005. In Fall 2006, the under 25 population went to 70.9% and decreased again to 70% in Fall 2007. Based on national projection data, the increase in younger student enrollment is expected to continue. The largest declines observed were among the 25-30 and 31-40 age groups.

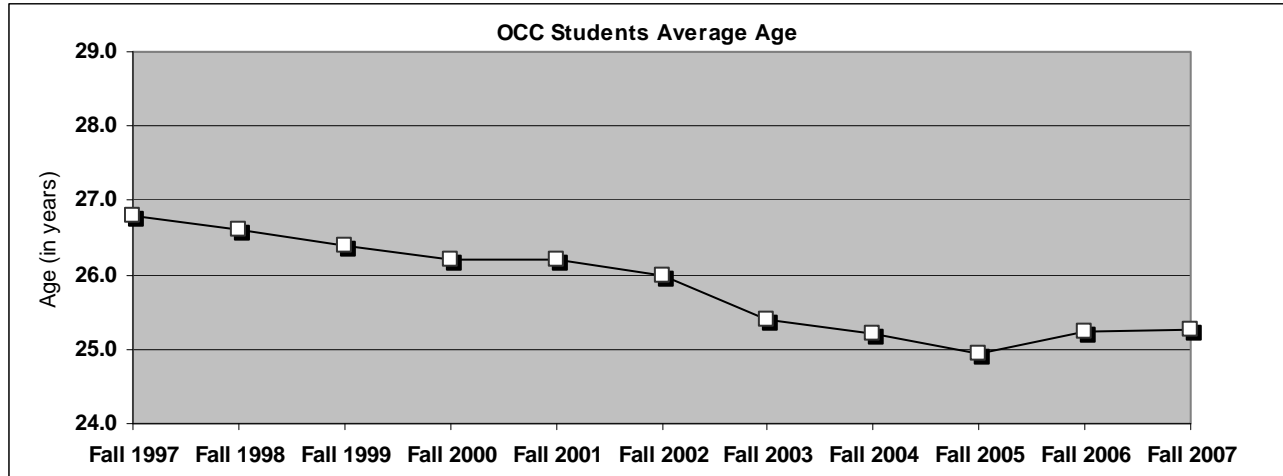

## Average Age

The average age of the OCC student population has been slightly decreasing since Fall 1998. In Fall 1997, the average age of OCC students was 26.8 years. In Fall 2005, the average age of OCC students was at a ten year low at 24.9 years of age. By Fall 2007, the average age of OCC students increased slightly to 25.3 years of age.

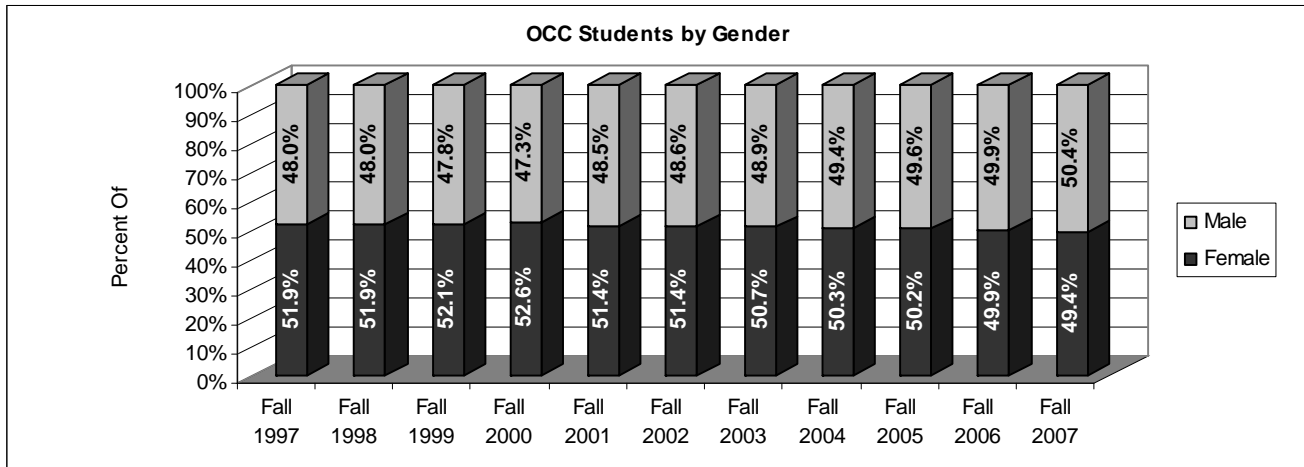

## Gender

Fall 2006 marked the first time in the past 10 years where the male and female populations at OCC were even. Male students made up the majority of OCC's students in Fall 2007 (50.4%). The percent of females increased from 51.9% in Fall 1997 to 52.6% in Fall 2000, then decreased to 49.4% by Fall 2007. Over the past 10 years, the national trend has shown females outnumbering male students.

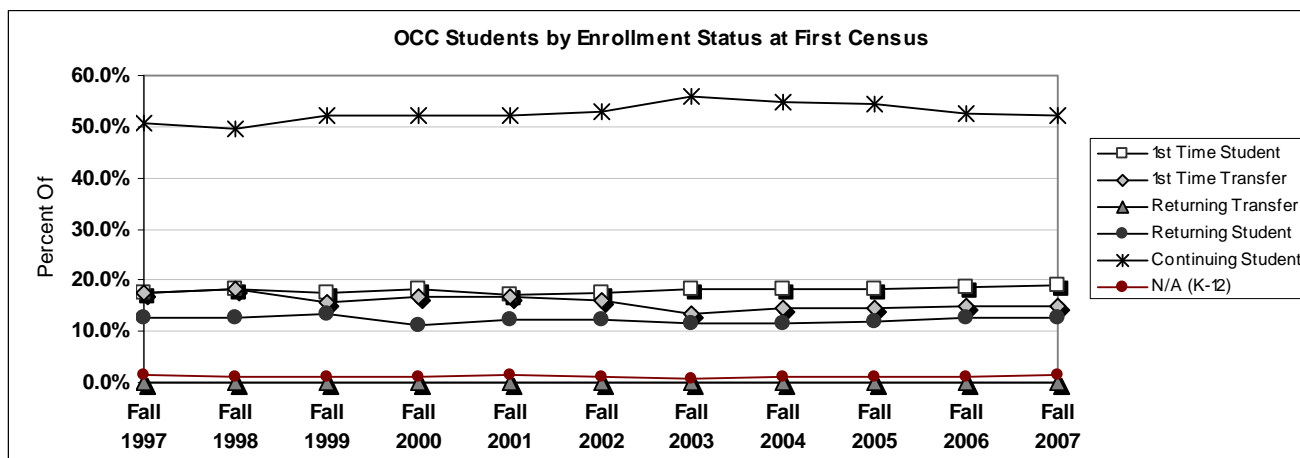

## Admission Status

A slight increase has occurred since Fall 1997 among students identifying themselves as first time students. Self-declared first time students accounted for 17.6% of all students in Fall 1997 compared to 19.1% in Fall 2007. Enrollment among students who stated they were first time transfer students has been less stable. Transfer students are those who have previously attended another college or university. Their enrollment increased through Fall 1998, continued to decline to 13.4% in Fall 2003, then increased to 14.9% in Fall 2007. The percentage of continuing students has been increasing since 1997 (50.5% to 52.1%).

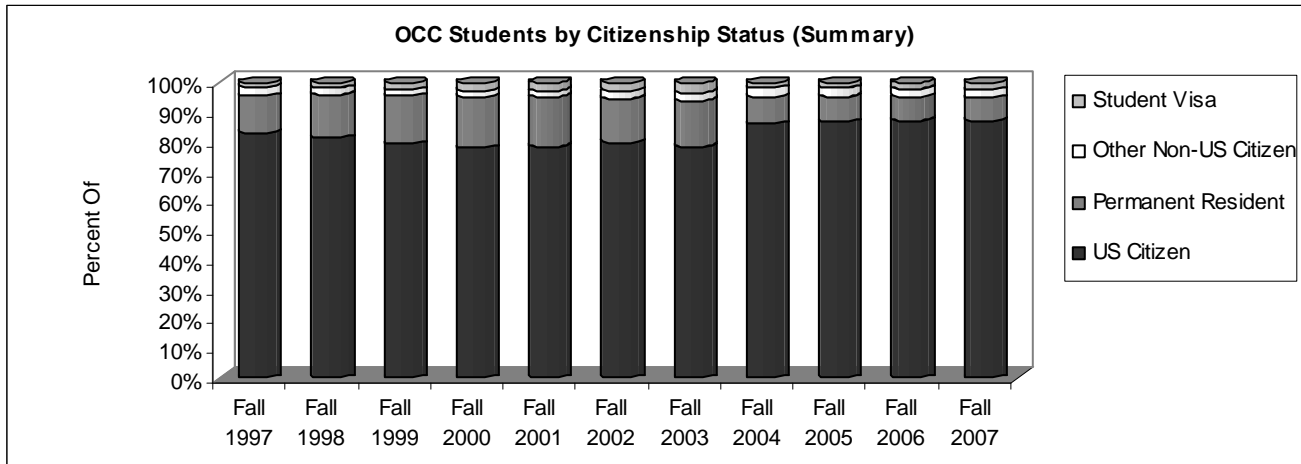

## Citizenship

US Citizens account for the majority of students enrolled. The number and percent of US Citizens enrolling at OCC began to increase in Fall 1998. In Fall 2007, the percent of US Citizens reached a high of 87.1%. There has been a decline in the number of students with a student visa, permanent residents, and students with refugee status since Fall 1997. Most noticeable are between Permanent Resident Students who have decreased from 15% in Fall 1997 to 7.9% in Fall 2007.

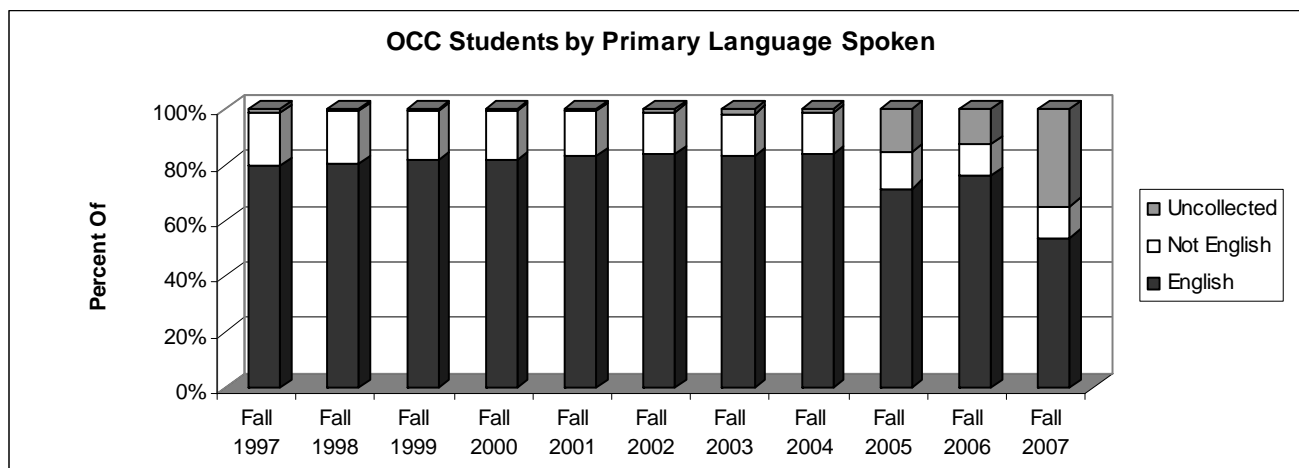

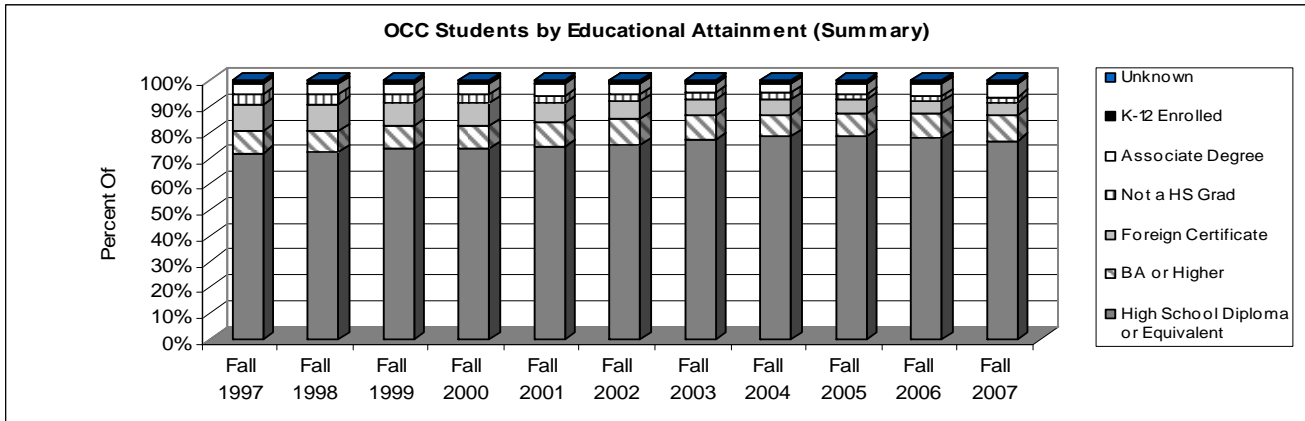

## Educational Attainment

The majority of OCC students have earned a high school diploma (72.4% in Fall 2007). This percentage has increased 4.4 % since Fall 1997 (67.9%). Students holding a BA degree or higher have increased since Fall 1997. Recent increases in Fall 2006 and Fall 2007 now show this group over 10% compared to 8.3% in Fall 1997. The recent decrease (Fall 2006 and Fall 2007) in the percentage of students with HS diplomas is directly related to the increase in the number of BA holders who most likely have a HS diploma. In Fall 1997, 10.4% of OCC students held foreign certificates, and this percentage has been decreasing since. The percentage of OCC students holding foreign certificates reached its lowest point (4.8%) in Fall 2007.

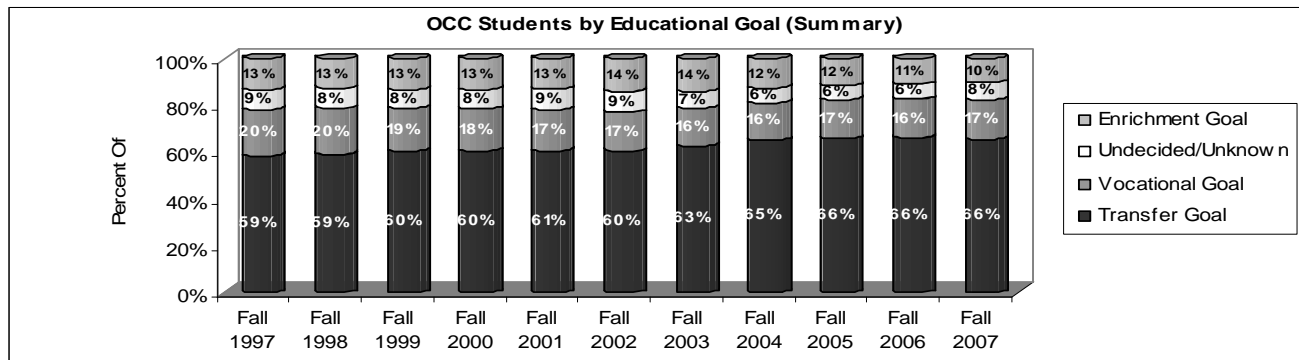

## Educational Goal

The educational goal is derived from the student's intent listed on their initial application to OCC. As of Fall 1997, the majority of OCC students (58.5%) indicate their intent to transfer. The percent of students who intend to transfer continues to increase through Fall 2007 (65.6%). A decrease in the percent of students with an undecided goal was observed from 13.7% in Fall 2003 to 9.9% in Fall 2007.

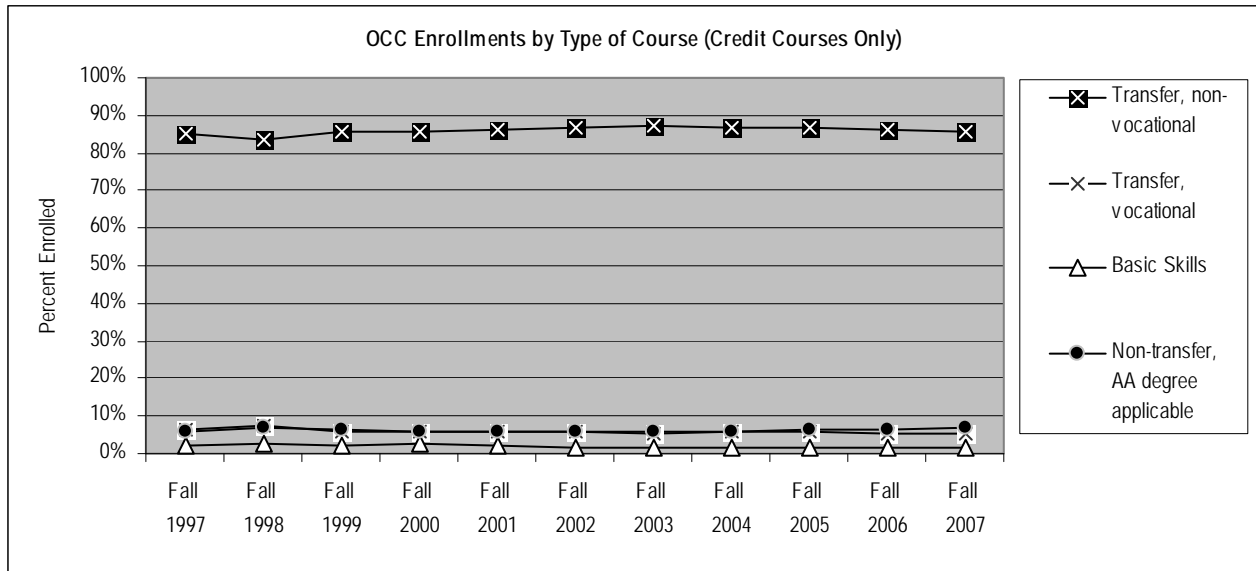

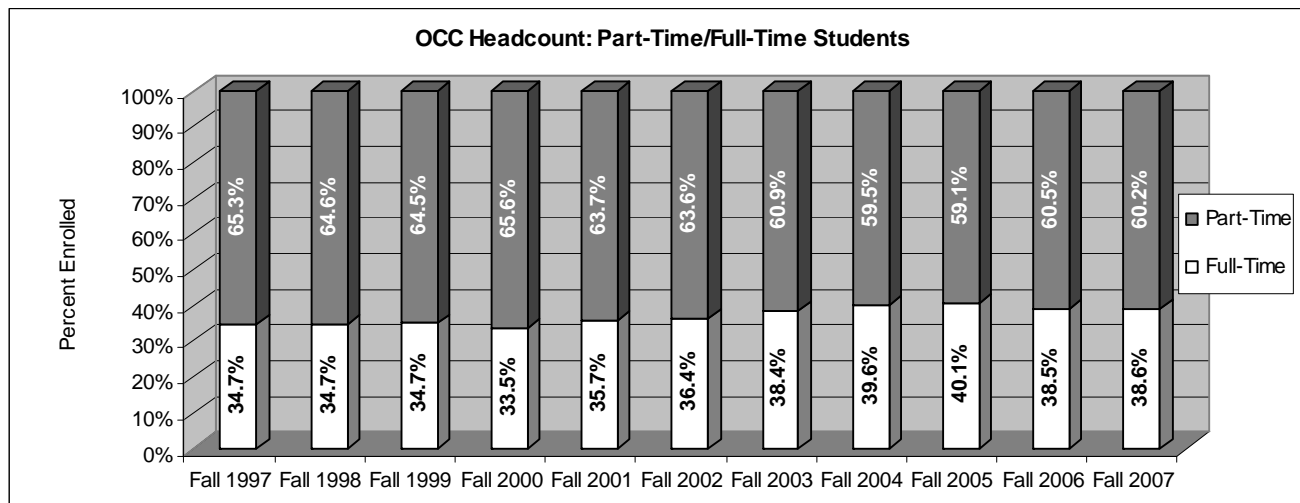

## OCC Full-Time/Part-Time Enrollment

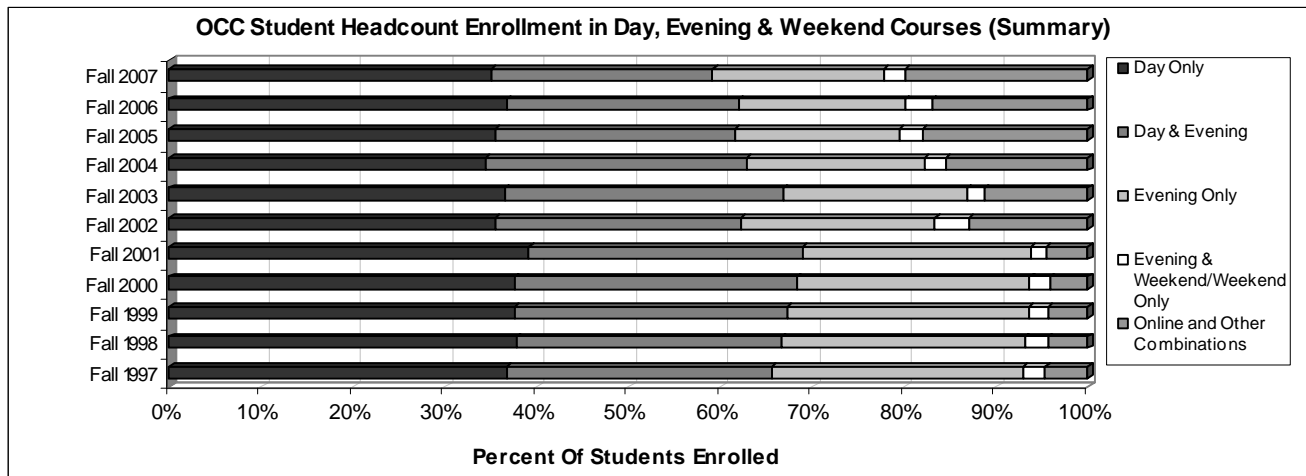

## OCC Student Headcount Enrollment in Day/Evening/Weekend Classes

Students enrolled in day classes account for the largest group in Fall 2007 (35.0%). Course enrollment trends indicate that students are taking courses at a wider variety of times and formats. The number of students taking at least one online class has increased from 0.3% in Fall 1998 to 16.2% in Fall 2007. Since Fall 1997, increases are observed in students taking classes in the following distinct categories: online only and online and other classes, and combination of day/evening/weekend courses. A large decline has occurred among students only taking evening classes from 27.8% (Fall 1997) to 18.5% (Fall 2007) and among students taking both day and evening courses from 29.3% (Fall 1997) to 24.2% (Fall 2007).

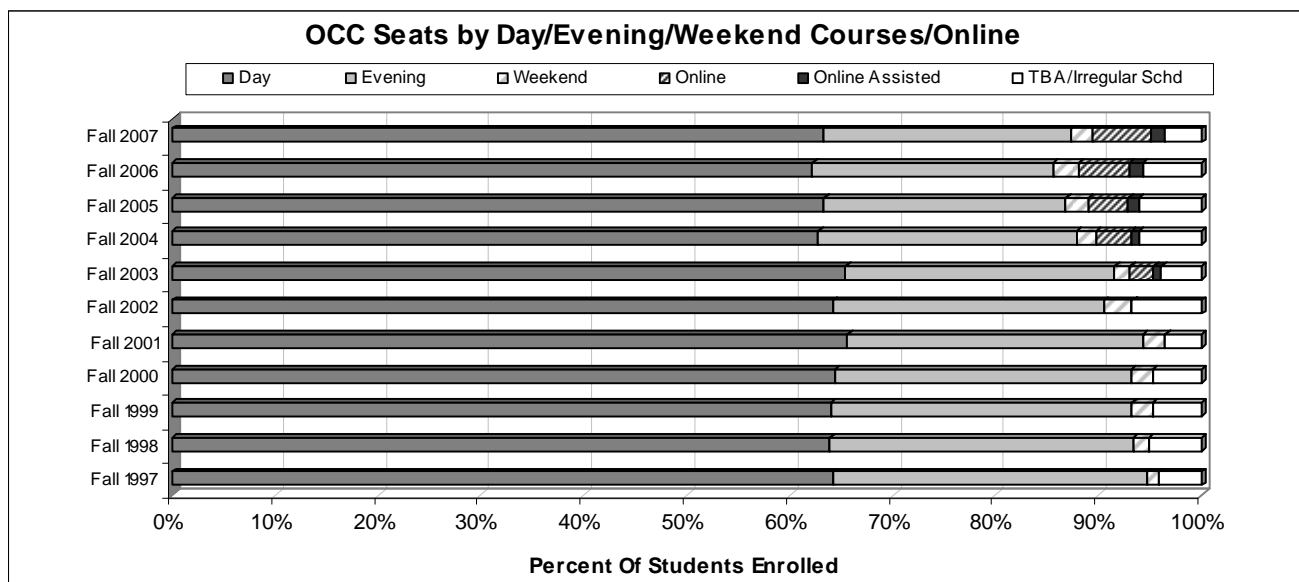

## OCC Seats by Day/Evening/Weekend Classes

The majority of course enrollments are during the day. Day class enrollment hit a ten year high in Fall 2003 (65.4%), and has shown slight fluctuations each year ending at 63.2% in Fall 2007. While the percentage of students enrolled in evening classes has shown a slight decline over the past few years, this decline appears to correspond to slight increases in enrollment in weekend classes and online and online/assisted classes. Online/online assisted classes have shown the largest increases and now account for 5.5% and 1.4% of all enrollments respectively.



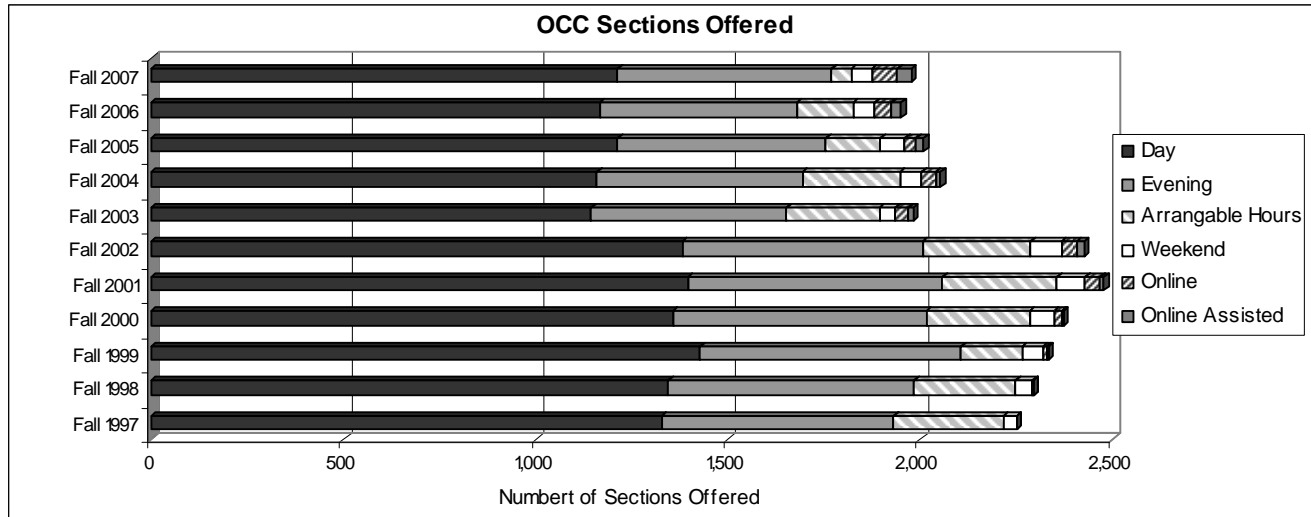

## Sections Offered by Day/Evening/Weekend Status

Section counts reported below are unduplicated counts. Increases in sections offered were observed from the mid 1990's through the early 2000's. The drastic drop in Fall 2003 sections reflect budgetary constraints rather than student demand. After Fall 2003, slight increases were observed in Fall 2004. Fall 2005 showed a 2.1% decrease in sections offered from the previous year, and Fall 2006 showed a 3% decrease from Fall 2005. There was a slight 1.4% increase in Fall 2007 from the previous year.
