



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT Orange Coast Community College 2005 – 2007

INTRODUCTION

This Articulation Agreement has been developed by the University of Redlands School of Business (URSB) and Orange Coast Community College. Its purpose is to help the prospective URSB student plan a course of study that will facilitate a more effective transfer into the URSB. URSB accepts a maximum of 66 transferable community college units that may be applied toward the units required for a baccalaureate degree. This agreement contains two sections:

Section I – lists relevant information about URSB General Education Requirements. The General Education requirements at URSB include four areas: Arts and Humanities, Behavioral/Social Sciences, Writing and Communication, and Math and Science. Listed under each area are equivalent courses offered at Orange Coast Community College.

Section II – lists lower division that will satisfy the Bachelor of Science in Business prerequisites and their OCCC equivalencies.

This agreement is based upon the 2005-2007 University of Redlands Catalog and the 2005-2006 Orange Coast Community College Catalog and is subject to review/revision at the discretion of the university.

Section I

Students in the University of Redlands School of Business must complete 120 units of semester academic credit with a minimum 2.0 GPA to earn their bachelor's degree. These must include 42 semester credits of General Education. A minimum of 9 of these credits must be earned at the upper-division level. No course can fulfill more than one subject area requirement.

Arts and Humanities Minimum of 12 credits

Behavioral/Social Science Minimum of 9 credits

Mathematics/Science Minimum of 9 credits At least one course in college-level mathematics and one course in natural science

Writing/Communication Minimum of 6 credits At least one course in English Composition is required

And 6 credits from any category
