GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS - 2007-2008

The Chapman University General Education pattern is new and will be effective fall 2008. It consists of four parts:

1. Freshman Foundation*
2. Shared Inquiry*
3. Inter/Multidisciplinary
4. Global Citizen*

***OCC's General Education Option 2 (CSU GE Breadth) or Option 3 (IGETC) certification will satisfy Part 1: Freshman Foundation, Part 2: All Shared Inquiry areas and Part 4: Global Citizen area except language if completed prior to transfer. Students must complete the remaining GE area, Part 3: Inter/Multidisciplinary.**

Part 1: Freshman Foundation

This requirement is waived for transfer students and freshman who have completed a minimum of 15 credits of college work after high school.

Part 2: Shared Inquiry

Courses approved for each of the *six* areas are listed below. *A course may be approved for multiple areas but can only be used towards one.*
