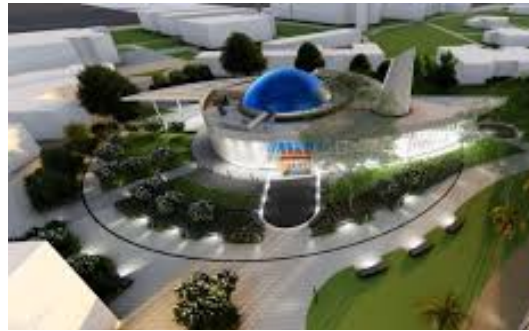
Stargazers: Intersections of Contemporary Art & Astronomy, Main & Project Galleries
